MINI-GRANT HELPS RESTORE A PART OF GOD'S CREATION

Colonial Presbyterian Church received an Earth Care Mini-Grant in December 2022 for the purpose of planting trees in a large field on the church's property. We now have five young oak trees growing in our field, as well as other donated plants, including native viburnums and two pawpaw trees. In addition to planting trees, we are working to landscape the field to create a walking path, as well as a wildflower area for pollinators. Another component of the plan is



partnering with a community organization that will create a Giving Garden on the property. The initial project will be growing blueberries, which will be distributed to people who cannot afford fresh produce.

Instead of contributing to the destruction of the environment by maintaining a large barren lawn, we are now helping to produce oxygen and remove carbon dioxide, provide habitat for wildlife, mitigate storm water, slow erosion, reduce air temperature, and create a place of beauty that can nourish the spirits of an entire community.
