


Her favorite foods are Thai and Tex-Mex. She loves a good street taco.






3. Favorite Season

RUSTBURG PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH HOLDS FINAL SERVICE

On January 7, 2024, Rustburg Presbyterian Church held its final worship service after shining the light of Christ in the village of Rustburg for 145 years.






The process creating our last worship service involved much discernment and consultation with those experienced with closing liturgies, including MCP Margie Anderson and Rev. Jen Brothers. The congregation was asked to select favorite hymns, and I included as many as possible in the service. I also wanted to involve two pastors who have been my mentors during my time at Rustburg: Rev. Dr. David Gellert and MCP Margie Anderson.

The liturgy of the service followed Rustburg's traditional worship format, using the lectionary for the first Sunday after the Epiphany, which focused on the Holy Spirit a fitting theme for my reflections. The most meaningful portion of the service involved remarks from members of the congregation related to areas of the sanctuary that we blessed as I walked around the room remembering our years of worship in the building.

We all felt the presence of the Spirit throughout the service, especially during the final hymn, "Here I Am, Lord." During the last verse, I felt led to walk to the back of the sanctuary and open the outside doors as a sign to the community that the congregation of Rustburg PC would continue to minister beyond the building.

How...? Cost for the educational trip is \$1120 + airfare**


**First time Peaks travelers to CEDEPCA are eligible to apply for a stipend to help defray the cost.
