
### Holbrook Presbyterian Church, Danville



# Clarksville Presbyterian CPC Mini Grant

In 2023 Clarksville Presbyterian became a Matthew 25
Congregation, focusing on alleviating poverty in our local
community. Soon after, we were asked to participate in
CarePortal, a partnership between local churches, Mecklenburg
County Social Services, and Patrick Henry Family Services, with
the goal of helping to meet the needs of families in crisis. We have
responded to requests from Social Services for seven families
with specific needs -- beds, baby equipment, blankets, bed linens,
clothing, toys, etc. The mini-grant of \$500, in combination with
donations from our generous congregation, have enabled us to
provide these basic items and to develop a connection with the
families. Members of the congregation have become fully
engaged with this project, and we have recently organized a room
to collect some of the items most frequently requested.

# Peaks Grants at Work in Our Communities



### **CPC 2023 Mini Grants**

Christiansburg Presbyterian	In partnership with three other churches in town (Belmont Christian Church, Blue Ridge Church, and Three Strand Church) we provide a food pantry every Saturday morning for those less fortunate in the area. The pantry, called "For Your Table," distributes 18-30 boxes of non-perishable food items to families in need every week. Our \$500 was added to the food pantry fund.
Forest Hills, Martinsville	Spent the generous grant of \$500 from the Presbytery along with our funds to help a family whom our school had recommended as having a difficult time right now.  We provided them with Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners and holiday presents, along with clothes for school, church, and work. The grant money allowed us to make their lives a little easier during a time that has been very hard for them.
Holbrook	Holbrook Street utilized the \$500 Mini Grant to pay for a cleaning service for our Fellowship Hall and a catered lunch for our Annual Congregational Meeting.
Massie's Mill	Massies Mill Church are in the process of gathering funds and commitments so that we can replace our old plastic sanctuary chairs with some new, more comfortable ones. And as you can imagine, an unanticipated check for \$500.00 will certainly help to accelerate our efforts.
Second Presbyterian, Roanoke	Plans to fund a joint lunch/dinner between Second and Loudon Ave Christian Church as we continue to build bridges through our Bible in Black and White study.
