

Illustrated Scope & Sequence (Outline)



The Earth Care Subcommittee of the Justice and Mercy Commission of Presbytery of the Peaks would like to encourage you to consider holding a study in your congregation of the 2024-2025 Presbyterian Women/Horizons Bible Study. Perhaps the women in your congregation will be using this study throughout the upcoming year, but you may not know that the lessons will also work with other groups in your congregation and in other settings of adults, including university and college students and older youth. Such a study could broaden engagement with earth care across the wider community of your congregation.

From the introduction:

"Like the rest of society, Christians easily overlook environmental justice. For decades, interest in ecology was equated with care for nature, a concern viewed by some as competing with human justice. But environmental damage harms people too....We are called to care for creation because the earth and its members belong to God, but also, crucially, because a healthy creation sustains human well-being."

We invite you to join Presbyterian Women as we explore, with all our hearts, God's call to care for our neighbors and for creation. In the study, participants will learn about ecological systems, the challenges we face in this time of accelerated climate change, and the possibilities available to address or counter the impact of human-made stress on our environment. Further, they will explore theological questions that point us to act and engage, in small and large ways.

The author of the study, the Rev. Dr. Patricia Tull is Professor Emerita at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, and has been studying, teaching and writing on this subject for decades.


